Bosom Buddies: Donation to provide mammograms and other items for women who cannot afford them

Collier Harvest: Delivery of bread and baked goods to the needy

Guadalupe Social Services: Provides support to those in need in Immokalee through donations and volunteers to help with the pantry and soup kitchen

Habitat for Humanity: Donation helps fund building of homes locally

Laces of Love: Donation provides new shoes for needy children

Miracle Limbs: Donation to local organization which provides artificial limbs for amputees

Sarah Ann Drop-In Center: Donation to help those with mental illness integrate into the community

School Supplies: New school supplies are collected for local teachers to provide to children in need

Scholarships: College scholarships are given to 2 local high school grads

Shower Supplies: Delivery of toiletries to Guadalupe Center
